Minutes of the Sunshine Baseball Club Annual General Meeting 12th August 2022

The meeting was opened at 7:03, Robert Browne (President) welcomed everyone.

The minutes of the 2021-2022 annual general meeting were circulated. Vic Rand moved that they be approved. The motion was seconded by Gerry O'Connor. The motion carried.

Reports of Officers (Robert Browne, President) indicated that all reports had been circulated and officers would highlight main points and themes

Presidents Report - Robert Browne

Robert thanked the committee, coaches, players, and spectators and stated the importance of reestablishing out of Covid. He expressed that 2023 would be another challenging year but with greater access to the ground due to the relaxing of council restrictions. He acknowledged it was a great year for junior numbers and credited Gavin Fischer for his work.

Vice President Report (Financial) - Graham May

Graham referred to his written report and stated his uncertainty at the start of the season due to Covid delays. He expressed there was a big effort in securing grants. With \$92k total, it was the club's biggest year. The committee decided to assist members once again by waiving club fees. Balance sheets were updated by removing inherited assets causing a \$31k book loss, however this was not depicted in the actual bank balances. He mentioned that an up-to-date asset register had been established in Xero and bank accounts were sitting at approximately \$80k. He gave thanks to Vicki, Rob, and Michelle Haxby (auditor).

Secretary Report - Michael Ashburn

Mike was dialed in via a phone call, he tabled his report and expressed appreciation for all the help from the club.

Registrar - Marion Baartmans

Marion tabled her report and mentioned there was not a lot to report due to membership fees being waived.

Director Of Baseball - Luke Searle

Luke was absent and has his report was read by Graham May. Graham mention that Luke had decided to step down from the role.

Social Coordinator / Covid Safe Coordinator - Joanne Formosa

Jo tabled her report.

Facilities And Grounds - Chad Galloway

Chad was an apology for the night, his report was tabled and read by Graham May. Gavin Fischer provided an update on some facility projects, he mentioned he was working with the council on the installation of new hitting tunnels and that these had been moved to the third base line, had a budget of \$150k and a sub committee was being established. The concept of the hitting tunnels is that they could be used 365 days a year and initial plans were provided.

Sponsorship, Marketing, Grants - Glenn Letts

Glenn provided thanks to all sponsors, stating that they play an important part for the club. He mentioned that a new silver sponsor (Brown Dog Design & Print) had been acquired, and that he was still seeking new sponsors. He provided an update on Village Roadshow in which he stated that Village Roadshow Limited had been sold and ended its sponsorship in June 2022. He mentioned, however, that the Kirby family had committed ongoing financial support of the club and had increased their contribution considerably. He updated numbers on membership programs, which had been affected during Covid, and stated that a pitching machine had been purchased via a volunteer's grant. Finally, he expressed that the winter baseball program had been strengthening with 4 teams and tee ball for 2022, mentioning that we were the biggest winter junior club in the city/west region.

Junior Coordinator - Gavin Fischer

Gavin referred to the reports from the junior caches and thanked all involved. He gave a summary of each team's performance and thanked all scorers and volunteers that had helped throughout the season. He also thanked Chad for ground marking, Sandy for running the canteen and all umpires.

It was moved by Eric Nichols and seconded by Robert Blackmore that all reports be received. The motion carried.

Election of Office Bearers for the 2022-2023 Season.

- David Richardson assumed the chair and thanked Rob for his great work throughout the year. David declared all positions vacant and called for nomination for President. 10. Rowan Harman & Associates for auditing our books and ensuring we abide to financial requirements – Thank You.



REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Registrations - Marion Baartmans - season 2022-23

As the pandemic began to fade from our memories and life started to get back a little to where we were before it, SBC introduced the normal fees again for all players. Club components were set by the committee and formed one payment together with BV and BA fees in the registration portal. This season there were some updates to the system and most procedures ran smoothly.

Internal communication was once again set up through a shared One-Drive file which was able to be accessed by the Junior Co-Ordinator, the Secretary, the Treasurer and myself. It was a good way of working and separate from the SportsTG system, which is not always clear with reports. Our shared Excel spreadsheet gave us the information we needed and was regularly updated by Graham with finances and by me with new registrations. The SportsTG system was still relied on when we needed more detailed information. We carried on with this system through the winter season, but we collected the club component separately; this meant two payments/transactions for each player, and sometimes this was forgotten. However, after a quick follow-up, every player completed the process.


2 of the kids out of this team went on to play for the Twins U14's at the State Summer Competition to represent Sunshine. They had come a long way.





Notes to the Financial Statements

Sunshine Baseball Club Inc For the year ended 31 March 2023

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act [Vic]. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
